


Esperanza Rising

Ages 7–11: Esperanza Ortega lives a privileged life on her family's ranch with her parents and grandmother until tragedy strikes. Forced to leave her injured grandmother behind so the older woman can recover, Esperanza and her mother flee to California at the height of the Great Depression—and Esperanza's entire world is turned upside down. Instead of having servants take care of her every need, Esperanza struggles to adapt to life in a farm camp. But when her mother falls ill, it is up to Esperanza to support the two of them and reunite them with her grandmother in Pam Muñoz Ryan's *Esperanza Rising*.

Attending all sessions of *Jr. Book Club* is not required, but is recommended.




Pixel Art with Perler Beads

Intro to Podcasting

Ages 14 & Up: Start your own podcast at Haute Studio, a sound booth with the equipment and software you need to create professional-level recordings. In this introductory course, you'll discuss how to develop ideas for podcasts—from determining a show structure to writing a script—and learn how to use Haute Studio to give your listeners a premiere experience. Everyone will have a chance to practice on the mic and record an on-the-fly podcast with suggested topics. Wrap up your session using *PreSonus Studio One 4* to edit clips, add intro and outro music, and include an ad spot.

Free HIV & Hepatitis C Testing with Positive Link

Worried that you or a loved one might have been exposed to HIV or Hepatitis C? Get tested quickly and easily with Positive Link. Positive Link provides free testing, comprehensive prevention information, and services for people infected with or at risk of contracting these two viruses in South Central Indiana. If needed, Positive Link will refer you to a disease intervention doctor for help with treatment.

All testing is done on-site; no appointment is necessary. HIV testing requires a simple finger prick, and your results will be available in one minute. Hepatitis C testing requires a blood sample; Positive Link will contact you with your test results.

The House Is On Fire by Rachel Beanland

On Christmas Eve in 1811, the Richmond Theater suddenly caught fire in the middle of the Placide & Green Company's performance. The fire spread quickly, and with more than 600 people in attendance that evening, chaos ensued as people ran for the door, trampled others, and tried to jump from the third-floor windows. In the aftermath, four people find themselves entangled in the search for the true source of the fire while rumors of a rebellion by the enslaved people of the city spread in Rachel Beanland's fictional retelling of the historic Virginia Theater Fire.
