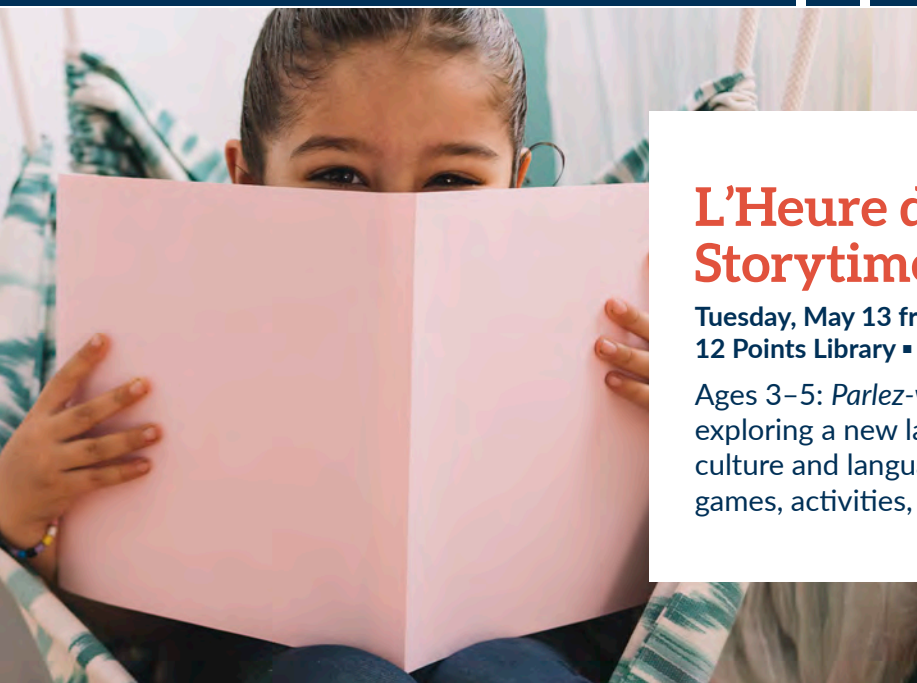

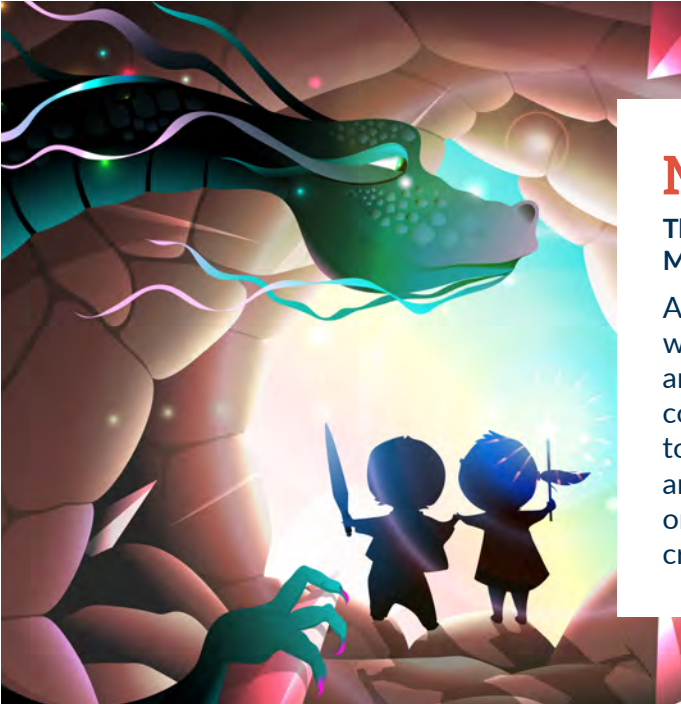
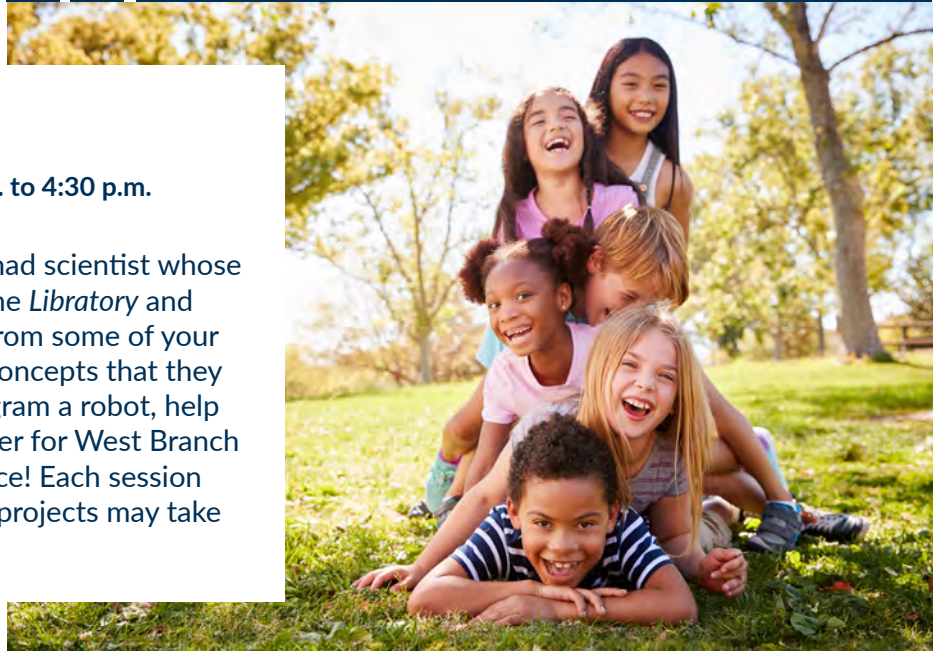




## Libratory
