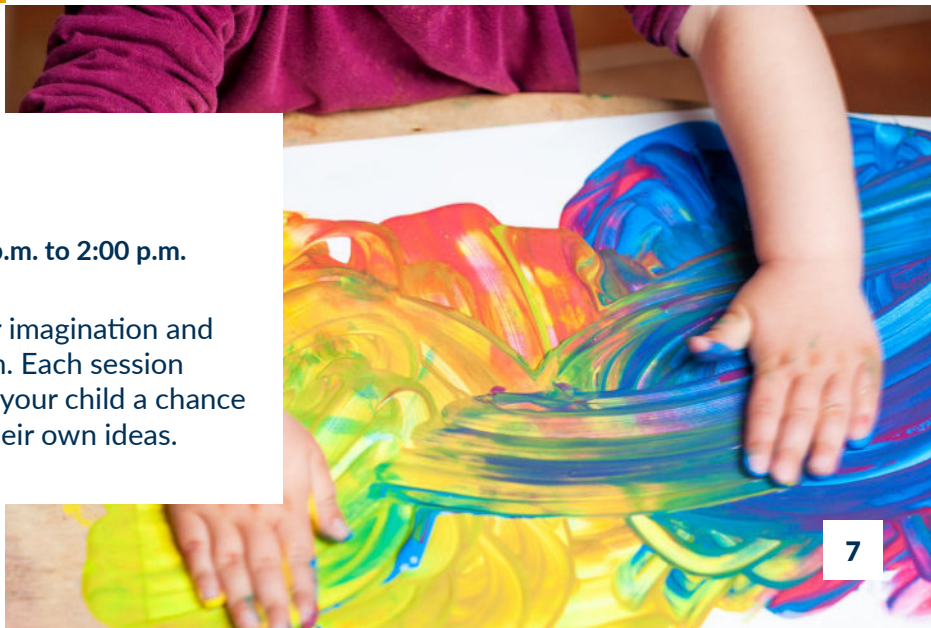


## Art Start

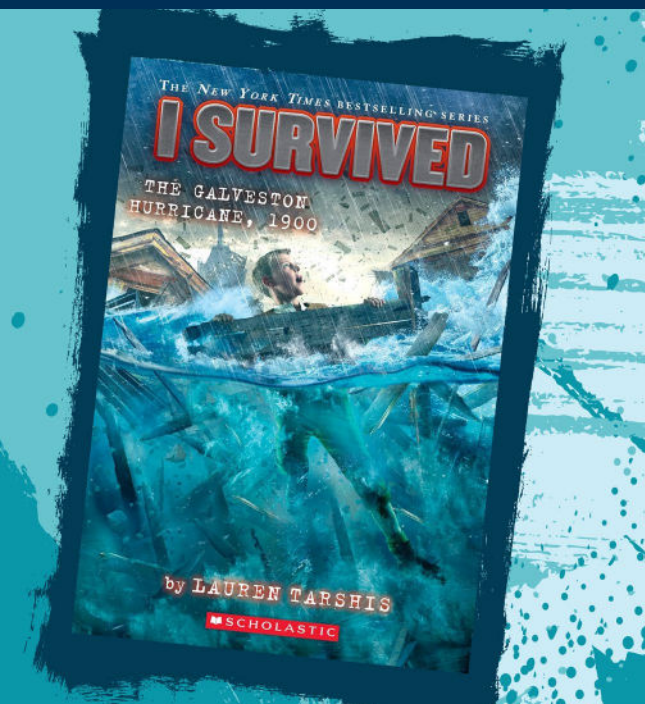
