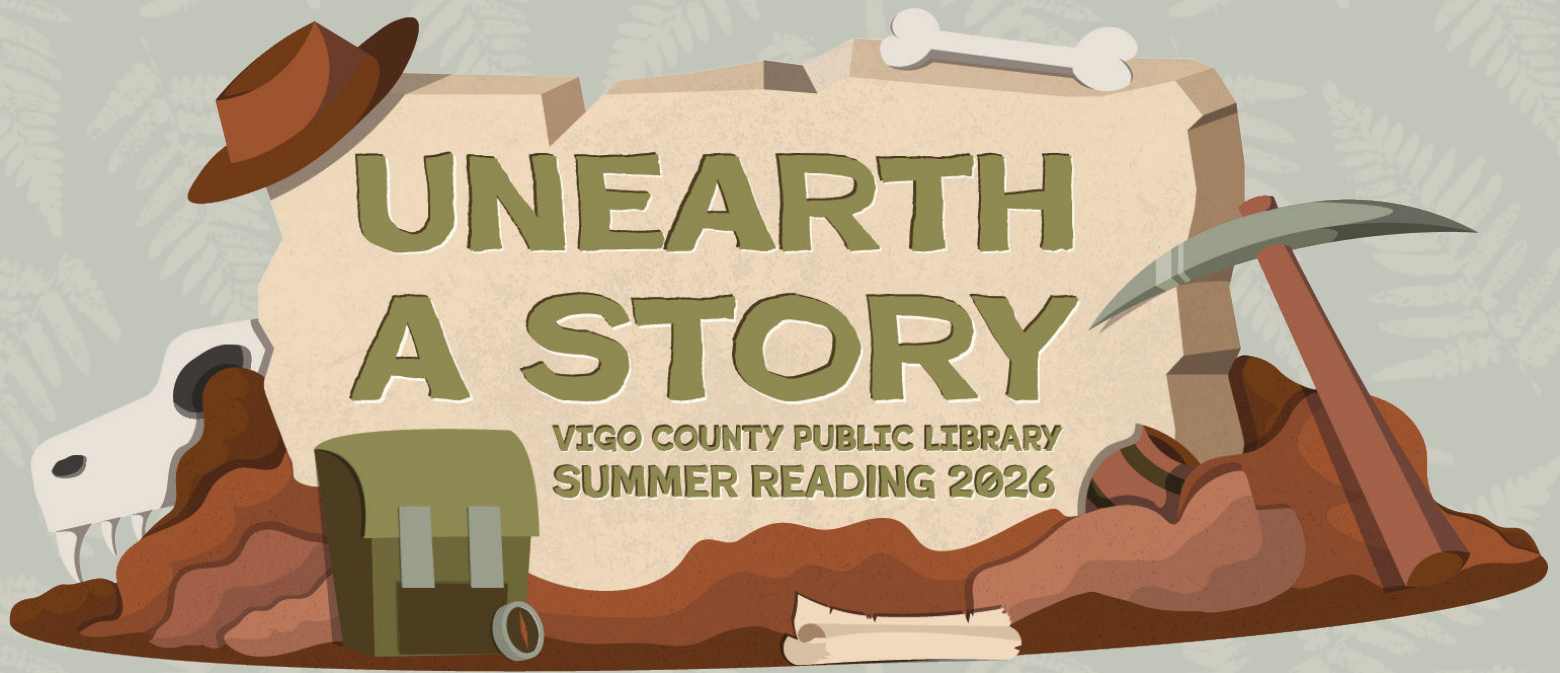
LIFE SIZE OREGON TRAIL AT DEWEY POINT
